**On March 3, at the Basilica, a massed choir and the Newfoundland Symphony Orchestra Sinfonia**, will perform classical music revived from reconstructed original manuscripts found in the churches of Nain, Hopedale and Makkovik. The music includes works like Mozart’s Ave Verum Corpus and movements from Handel’s Messiah. You will hear some familiar tunes by composers you know well but, with text transcribed in the Inuktitut language, they take on a wonderful perspective that is treasured in the Inuit communities of Labrador. This concert will be even more meaningful for you as a parishioner as the show includes classical works for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday - all repertoire that the church choirs in Labrador have sung for hundreds of years!
